Many students will choose to retake the SAT test to improve their scores. The SAT is required for college admission and for scholarships. The fee for the SAT test is \$60.00 which includes the writing test. The SAT without the writing test is \$46.00. Your counselor can give advice about which option is best for your student and if it would also be a good idea to take an ACT test.

10. **SPORTS PHYSICALS:** Consistent with the Michigan High School Athletic Association rules for athletic participation and eligibility, Unity requires that a student-athlete pass a sports physical in order to be eligible to try out for and participate on athletic teams. In addition, all middle school students who participate in 78er football are required to have a physical. It is recommended that ALL students (no matter age) receive a physical prior to athletic participation.

The policy of Unity and the MHSAA is that a current sports physical must be on file for the current year; that is, any sports physical passed on or after April 15, 2018, will make the student-athlete eligible for the 2018/2019 school year athletics.

11. **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY:** “Becoming a PIC.” A fundraising activity of Unity athletics is the concession stand which is open at most home athletic events. One requirement of the Health Department is that when the concession stand is open, its staffing is supervised by a “person-in-charge” (PIC). Becoming a PIC simply requires taking a short online training class and certification test offered by the Health Department.
