1. **ENROLLMENT FOR 2019-20:** Enrollment for next school year will be done online through Final Forms (<https://unitychristian-mi.finalforms.com>). If you have a current 9th – 11th grade student at Unity and have not registered your student(s) in Final Forms, we ask that you do so as soon as possible (instructions were mailed home in January and in March). If you have any questions, please call Krista in the school office. An email will be sent to all families when enrollment is open. This email will come after the April 15 Association Meeting.

Incoming freshman for 2019/20: a letter will be mailed home after spring break with instructions on how to register your student in Final Forms.

2. **TUESDAY, APRIL 9, STANDARDIZED TESTING DAY:**

Schedule:

- Freshmen & Sophomores will be taking the PSAT in the morning and will be dismissed at 12:00 p.m.
- Juniors will be taking the SAT and will be dismissed at 1:00 p.m.
- Seniors do not have school and we request they do not come to school prior to 2:00 p.m. Tech Center is required for seniors.

Transportation:

- All AM busing (both UCHS routes and Hudsonville Public routes and shuttles) will run as normal.
- At 12:00 noon, freshman and sophomore students will be dismissed for the day after testing; UCHS buses will run their normal routes at 12:05 p.m. Additionally, Bus #03 will take freshman and sophomore students home who live south and east of UCHS; UCHS Bus #04 will take freshman and sophomore students home who live north and west of UCHS.
- Juniors must provide their own transportation home when they are dismissed.
- Unity will return to a normal busing schedule on Wednesday, April 10.
- K-8 students using UCHS busing will be picked up normally and shuttled as necessary in the morning on April 10.

3. **TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION FOR UNITY STUDENTS WHO RIDE HUDSONVILLE PUBLIC SCHOOL BUSES:**

April 12 (Prom): Students will be dismissed at 12:25 p.m. Bus #03 will take students home who live south and east of school and bus #04 will take students who live north and west of school home. Unity buses will run as normal.

May 10: Hudsonville Public buses will NOT run their PM routes on May 10. Hudsonville Public buses will provide Hudsonville Christian with limited busing for their PM routes. Unity students who plan to use this limited busing should board Unity bus #06 or #11 to be shuttled to Hudsonville Christian Elementary and/or Middle School.

Unity will provide PM busing for all students these two days. Bus #03 will take students home who live south and east of school and bus #04 will take students who live north and west of school home.

Unity buses will run their normal routes on Friday.

5. **SPRING PLAY:**

6. **CONGRATULATIONS TO UNITY STUDENTS:**

- **Congratulations to the Math Challenge Teams:** On Saturday, March 16, Unity sent two teams of 9th and 10th graders to compete at GRCC in their annual Math Challenge against 11 other teams from area schools. The Black team made up of Nathan Steinfort, Ashley Vredevoogd, Aubrey Velzen, Abby Dykstra, Luke Schmidt and Elena Kemper finished 5th in their division. The red team consisting of Morgan Ridder, Jennette Frens, Mackenzie Luurtsema, Danny Ye, Olivia Brinks and Seth Buit came in second in their division and fourth overall. These two teams of six worked together through four different events: Team Theme (the teams work together on a series of related problems), Pony Express (the team is under a 20-minute time limit to solve six challenging problems), the Written Quest (each team takes a 35-multiple choice test with the top four scores counting), and the Relay Rounds (each team member sitting in a row works on separate problems under a 5-minute time, but an answer is needed from the team member in front of him or her to solve his or her problem). Subway and snacks were enjoyed, and prizes including 1-lb. chocolate bars and logic puzzles were won by all in raffles.

- **Congratulations to the Science Olympiad Team** who participated in the regional competition at Grand Valley State University on Saturday, March 23. Unity's team competed against 27 other schools from around the area. This year there were 23 events ranging from chemistry lab, astronomy, dynamic planet, forensics, and write it, do it, to some new events such as boomilever, water quality, and codebusters. It was a great day for Unity's Science Olympians.

- **Congratulations to Unity's Michigan Youth in Government participants.** YMCA's Michigan Youth in Government held their annual convention in Lansing February 21-24. This was Unity's 23rd year in the program and eight Unity students participated along with approximately 500 others from around the state.

Sarah Terpstra, Sam Kuipers, David Cremer, Calvin Voorhees, William Terpstra, Anna Terpstra, Madeline Nuiver, and Joel VanderZwaag as well as Raenah Lindsay from East Grand Rapids attended along with Mr. Johnson. All played the role of legislators in the House and Senate. Students prepare for the weekend by researching and writing their own bills. David Cremer's bill was passed through both the chambers and signed by the youth governor; it will now be given to Michigan's actual legislators for review.

While in Lansing, before settling into their duties, the Unity delegation had an opportunity to have lunch and discuss current issues with Senator Roger Victory and Representative Luke Meerman. Meeting at MSU's Kellogg Center and the Capital, using the House and Senate chambers, the students debated not only their own ideas, but also many others.

"It's a great experience for the students," said Mr. Johnson, "It gets them out of West Michigan and gives them a chance to meet other students, to share their own ideas and beliefs."

Other areas students can be involved in include a Mock Judiciary Process, national issues forum and the press corp. The entire conference gave the students time to make friends with people of varying viewpoints from around the state, as well as allowed them to be Christian witnesses to other schools.

“It was a ton of fun; I had a great time and was able to see how our state government works. I wish I had started as a freshman instead of waiting until my junior year,” said Senior Sarah Terpstra.

The weekend closed with a banquet on Saturday night, finding out who the Youth Governor would be next year, and which bills had been passed. Overall, MYIG is a fun, interesting, and enlightening experience and provides the students with a broader worldview and a chance to learn more about politics, government, and speaking up about the things that are important to them.

- ❖ Other dates for the SAT which students sign up for on their own are May 4, June 1, August 24, October 5, November 2, and December 7. Test dates for the ACT (Academic Collegiate Test) are June 8, July 13, September 14, and October 26, and December 14.

SENIORS

- College Bound seniors can now expect information directly from colleges on acceptance, financial aid, and scholarships.

Encourage your senior to read all mail from colleges to which they have applied. Once a college choice is made, a deposit is usually required to hold a spot in the freshman class. Failure to send in your deposit by May 1 may result in cancelled admission and lost college scholarships. **Once students make a final decision on which college they are attending, they should notify ALL colleges they applied to of their final decision.**
